What is Pervers/Cité?

Pervers/Cité is a collaboratively organized summer festival that aims to make links across social justice groups, queer communities, and radical visions of pride. In a climate of corporatized gay agendas and whitewashed homogeneity amongst queers, Pervers/cité strives to provide a critical and accessible schedule of activities, designed to bring back the radical underpinnings to the pride movement.

This year's festival is taking place from August 4th to 14th, a few days after Divers/Cité and leading up to Célébrations de la fierté Montréal 2011 community day and pride parade.

A Brief History:

The idea for Pervers/cité came out of a workshop facilitated by qteam Queers and Anarchism in early Summer 2007 at the Montreal Anarchist Bookfair about. One of the main conclusions of the workshop was that there was a strong need and desire for a summer pride fest in Montreal that was truly about community building and radical resistance, that would return politics to pride and provide a wider representation that was more reflective of diverse communities and experiences. More and more people felt like the Pride fest had become little more than a series of commercial, corporate events and expensive parties targeted exclusively at a middle-class white gay male audience. The question "Who's Divers/cité is this?" came up again and again.

This sparked the creation of a listserv called Pink & Black that became the networking tool for the first Pervers/cité organizing collective. Pervers/cité was held for the first time later that same summer and has happened every year since. The 2011 edition is the 5th edition of the festival.

Transportation

By Bicycle

- Montreal is a bicycle friendly city with bikes paths on many roads
- Rental bikes are available throughout the city through the Bixi program (<https://montreal.bixi.com>)
- Bicycles are allowed on the metro from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. and after 7 p.m. Monday to Friday, and all day Saturday, Sunday. Just board the lead car of train!

- The Metro closes between 12:30 and 1am, so if you will be out later you will need take a bus or cab to where you are staying.

- Taxi's are metered and it's common to tip 10% - 20%

By Car

- Driving in Montreal is not ideal as there are many one ways, no left turns, festivals blocking roads, erratic drivers and it's construction season!. Parking is also difficult and often expensive. It is usually quicker to park somewhere and use alternative modes of transportation to get around.

Queering CAMP: Screening of Alexis Mitchell's new video CAMP and discussion about silence and transgression in Jewish history and contemporary culture

Facilitators: Kat & Kinneret, with Alexis Mitchell via skype
Language: English, French Whisper Translation

CAMP is a 3-part, single channel, video essay exploring the secrets that underscore a personal relationship to Jewish history and culture. Through a look at 3 camp environments, the work engages with a queer re-telling of the traditional Purim story, the censored passages in Anne Frank's diary, and a haircut given by a grandfather in order to reveal the ways in which these secrets haunt the surface of our cultural moments. CAMP is framed through a play on the word 'camp' utilizing a camp sensibility within an analysis of temporary built environments. This frame seeks to expose histories that labour to keep hidden, and points to a larger fear of speaking out against injustice as a cause for silence. An online Q&A with the filmmaker and discussion will follow the screening of the short film.

Alexis Mitchell is a Toronto-based media artist whose video works and documentaries have screened in 5 continents. She has been creating performative documentary and hybrid visual works that focus on queerness, performativity, the body, the carnivalesque, architecture and queer notions of diaspora. Most recently, she completed an MFA in Film and Video Production at York University

Gender as Gender, a panel discussion on trans and gender queer drag!

Facilitators: Glenn Marla, Coral Short, & Johnny Forever

This panel discussion features Glenn Marla (New York), Coral Short (Montreal), and Johnny Forever (Montreal) in conversation about trans and genderqueer conceptions of drag. We are, all of us, the hidden basis of Judith Butler's bread and butter theory. If we talk about gender as performance, we cannot ignore the stage (and, as Viviane Namaste points out, the various forms of paid work that go into and come out of drag); however, for those of us who daily negotiate trans or queer genders off stage, the participation in onstage drag traditions comes with a set of non-traditional concerns, potentially imbuing drag itself with new meanings. Just how this happens is up to each of our panelists to describe to you! We will be sharing our perspectives and opening the floor for audience members to share

This is a collection of films which demand and invite the audience to explore their arousal, desire, curiosity in a gender agnostic way. A queer cacophony of visual penetration: a fist, a piece of fruit, a cock, an egg. We invite the audience to insert themselves in their own way.

Men Against Sexism Uprising: Stories & Thoughts from a Queer Prison Gang

Facilitator: Matty

Language: English, French whisper translation

Trigger Warning: talks about prison rape, queer bashing, sex slavery & child abuse
Men Against Sexism (MAS) was made up of almost entirely queer and trans prisoners. In the 70's, they successfully changed a whole culture within Walla Walla prison where rape and ownership over queer/trans prisoners went from being a power and status symbol to a reason to fear for your life.

Their work had a ripple effect to all the other prisons in the U.S. Northwest and 10 years later, according to MAS member Ed Mead, there were no more instances of rape within Walla Walla.

This workshop will include a telling of the story of Men Against Sexism from their perspective and look at some of the ways they were able to challenge cultural norms which targeted Queer and Trans prisoners. Followed by a discussion of the methods and tactics they used to keep themselves safe, and how those concepts of self defense could be applied to our modern day struggles as Queer/Trans Communities.
